

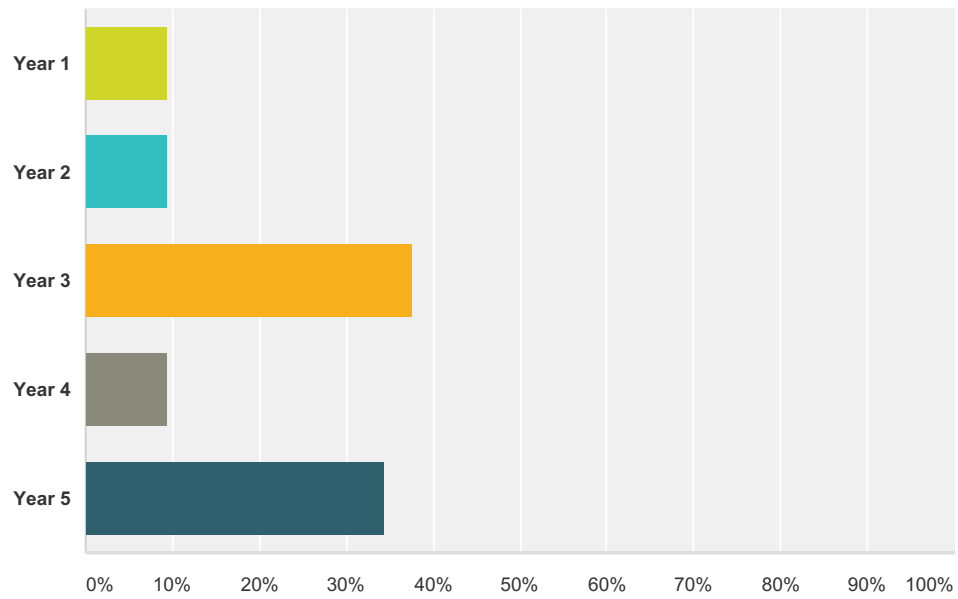

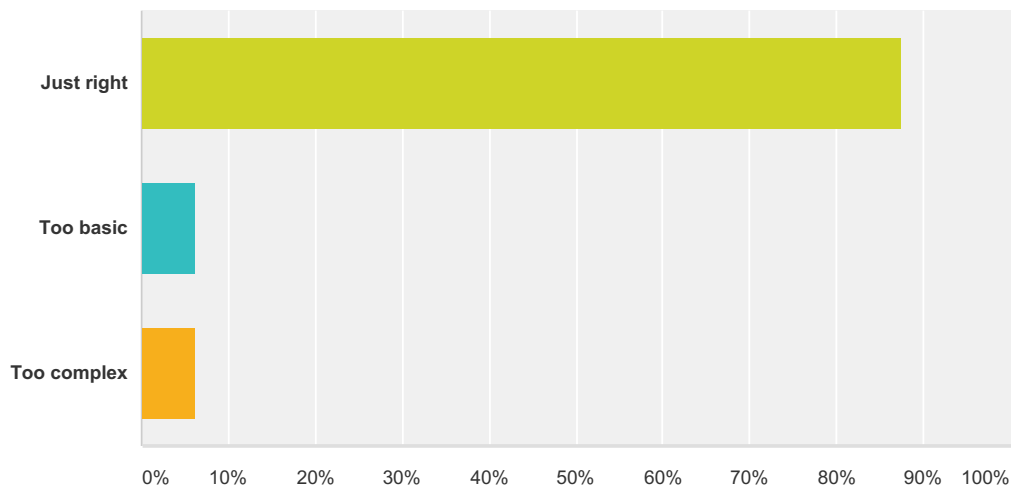

Q3 Did you feel that the level of the talks was appropriate?

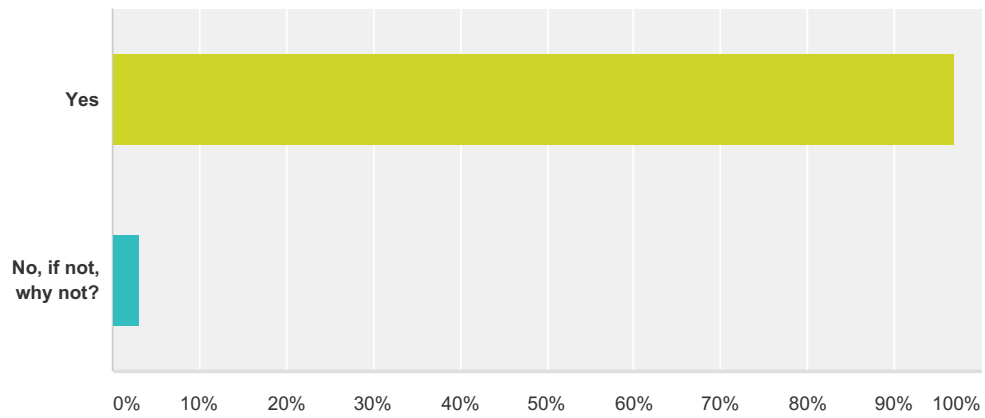

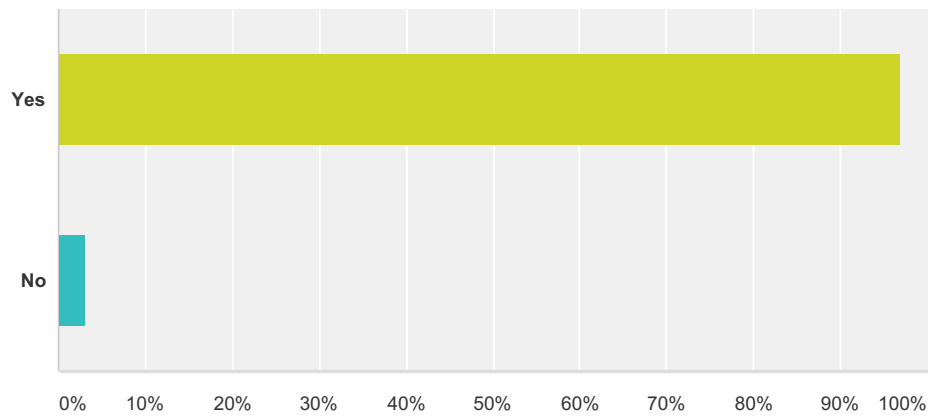

Q5 Has attending this event made you consider a career in pathology?

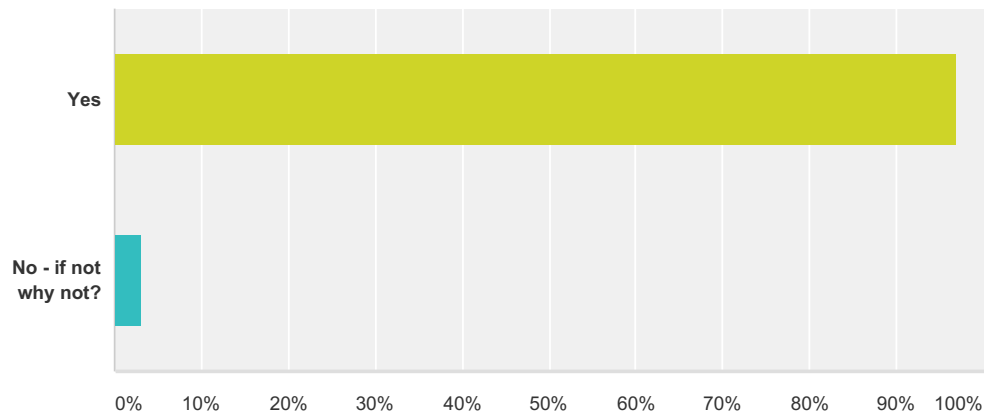

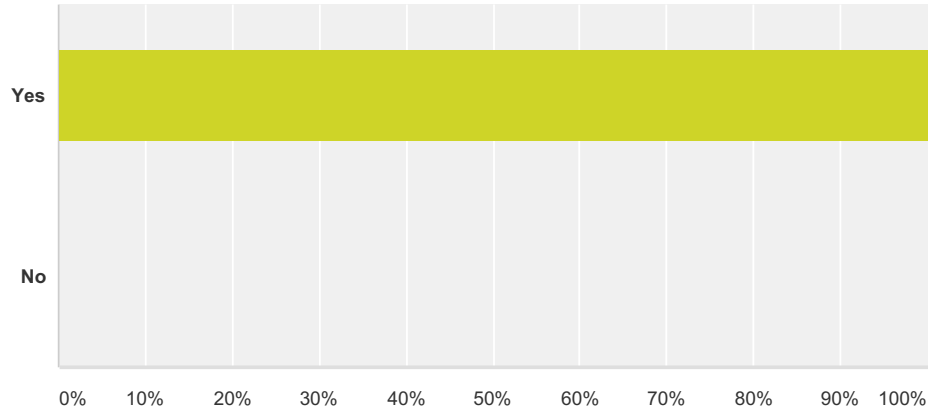

Q7 Do you feel that you have learnt more about histopathology and molecular pathology from attending this event?

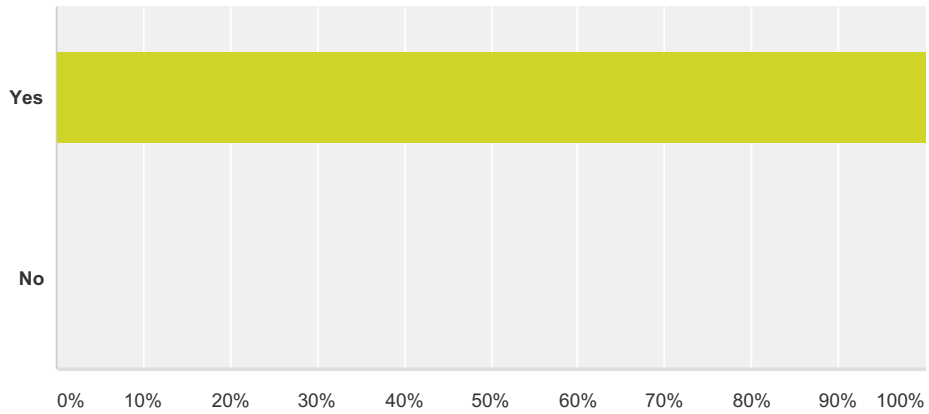

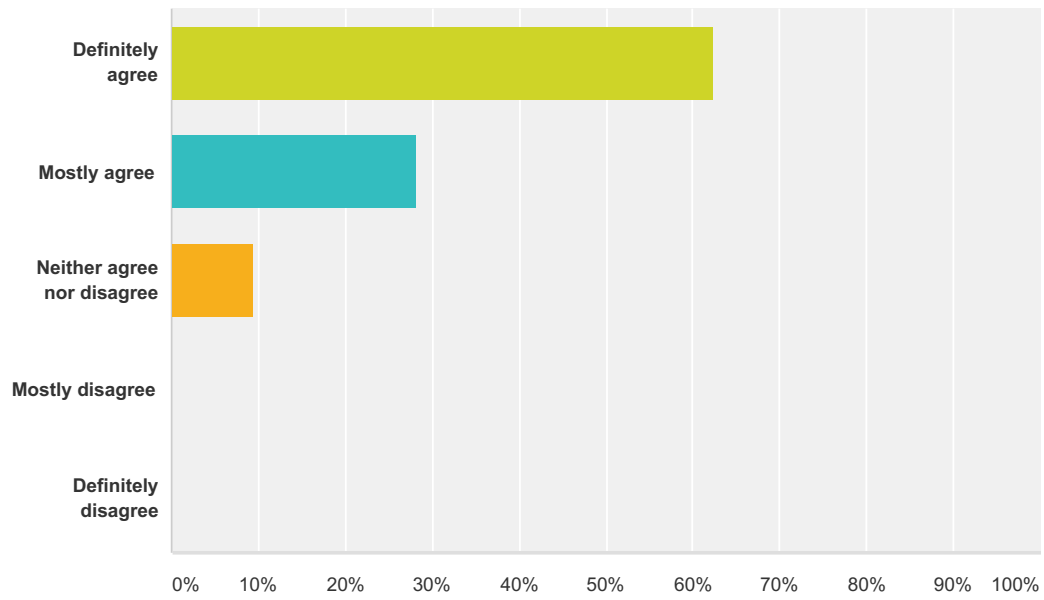

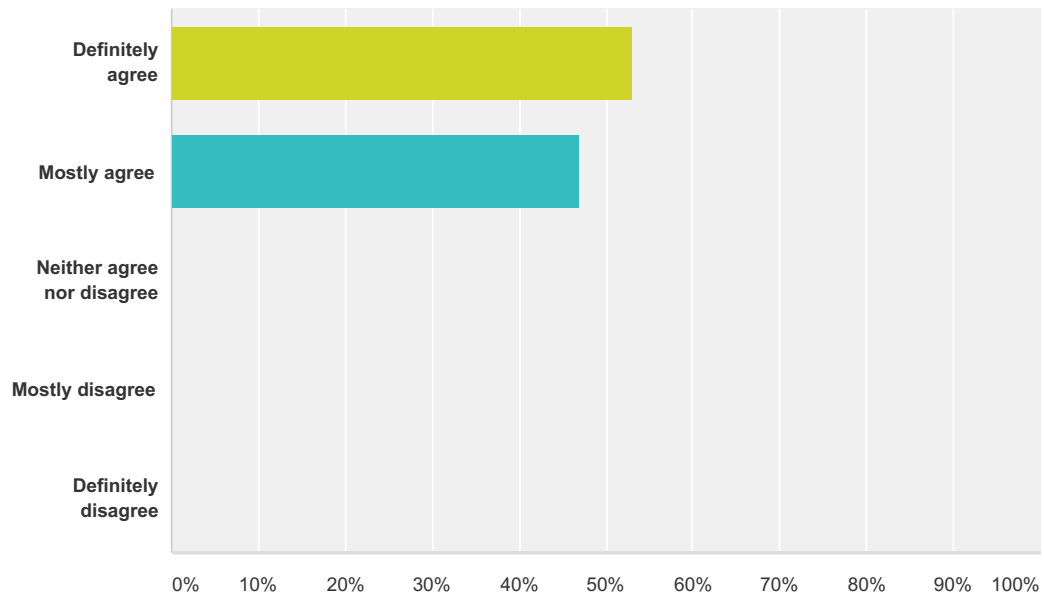

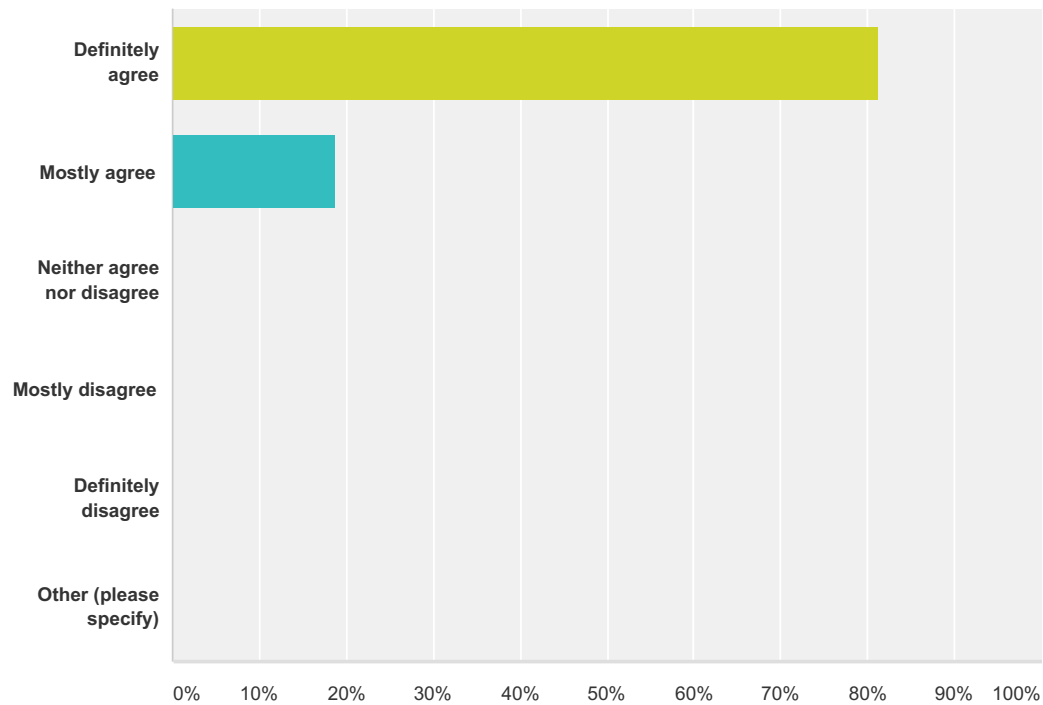

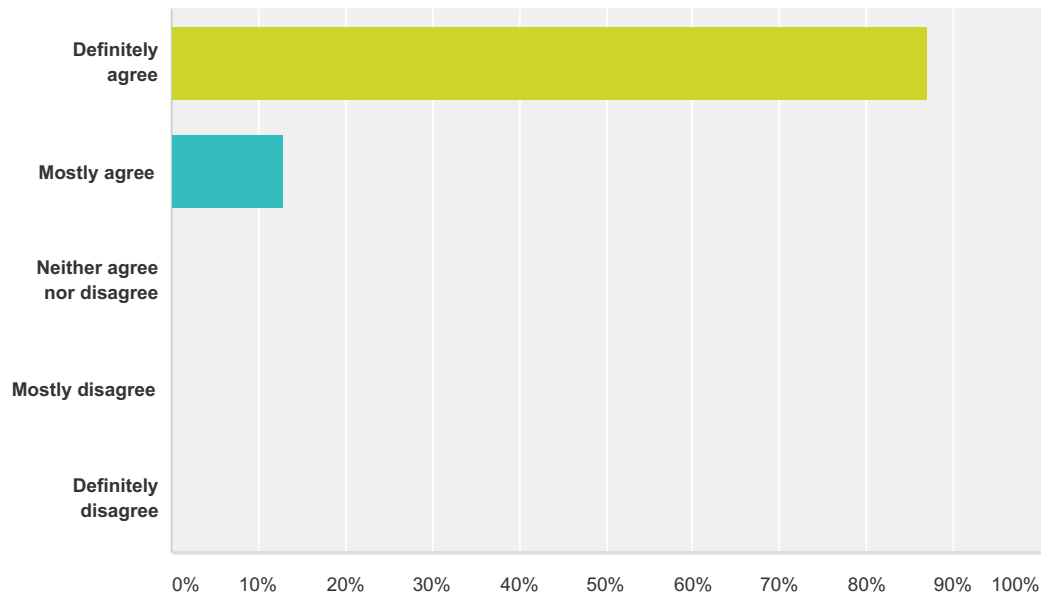

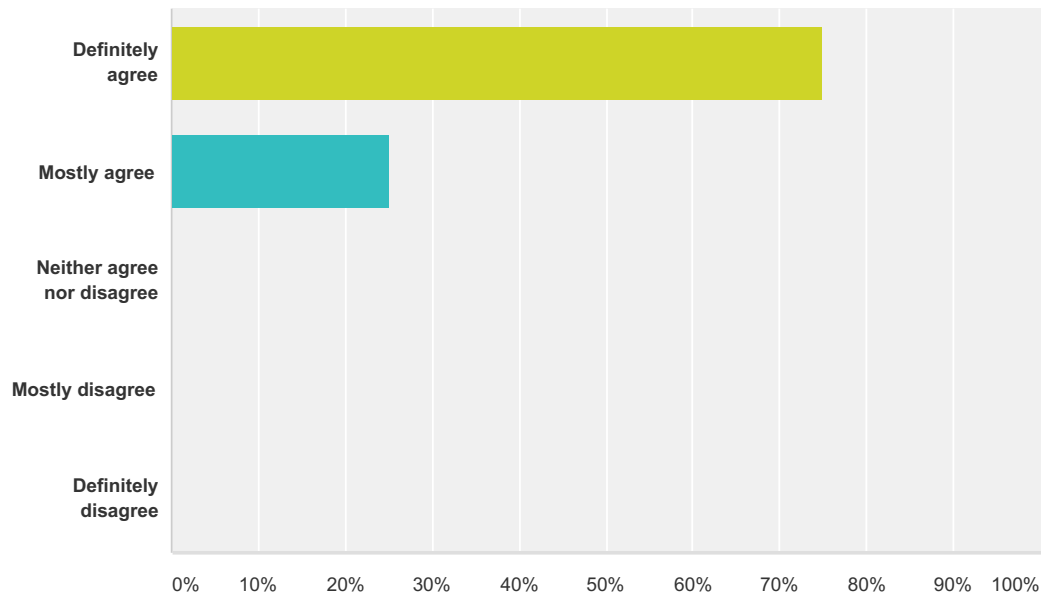

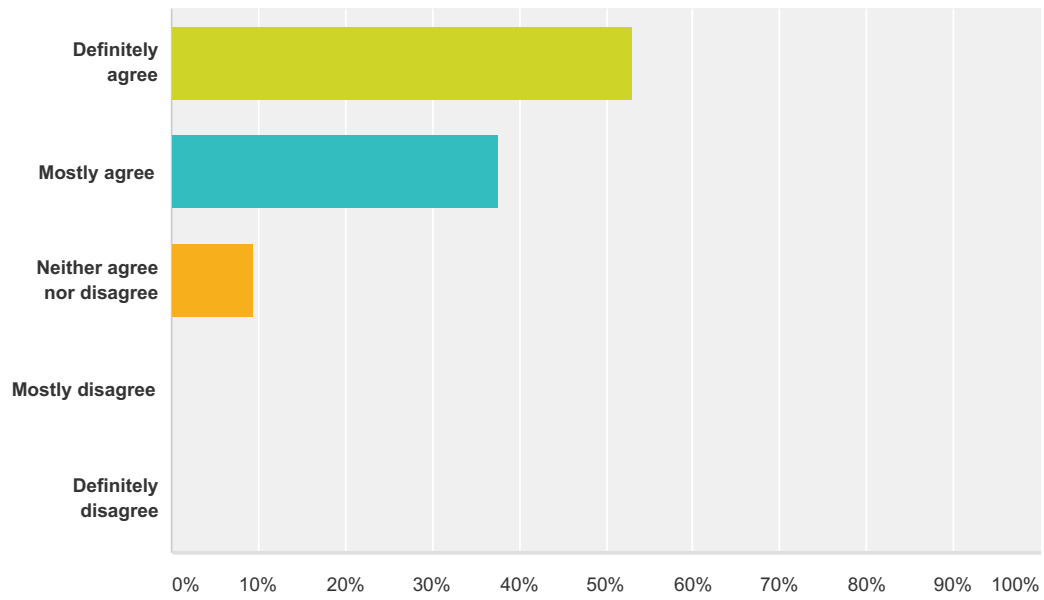

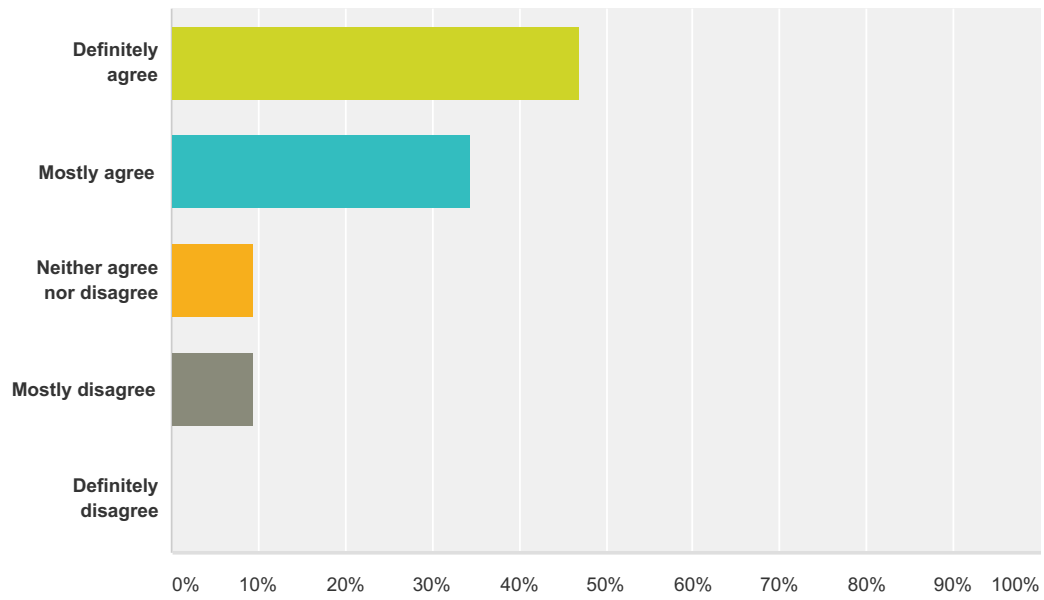

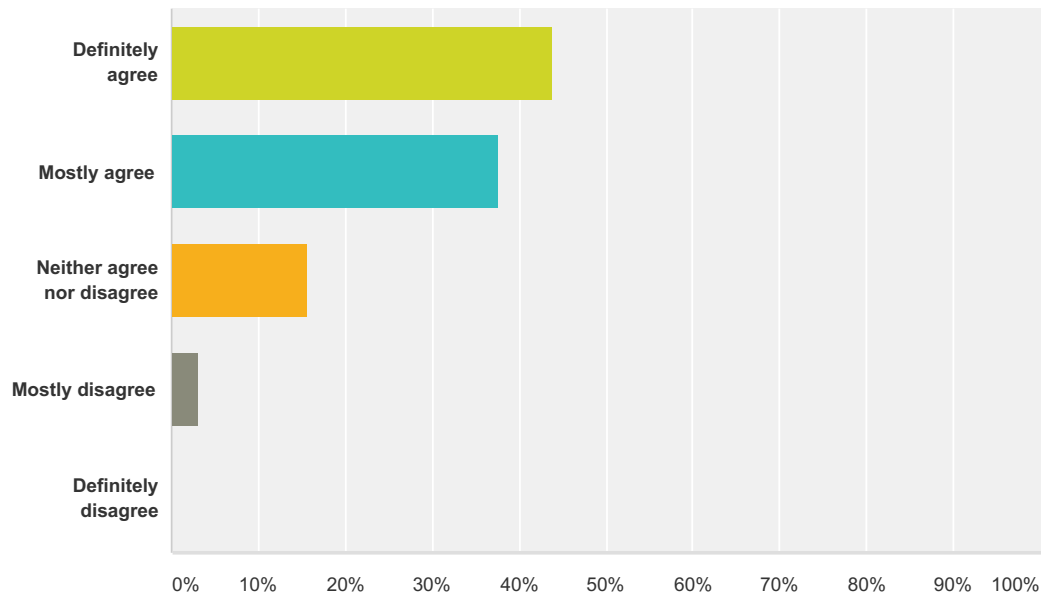

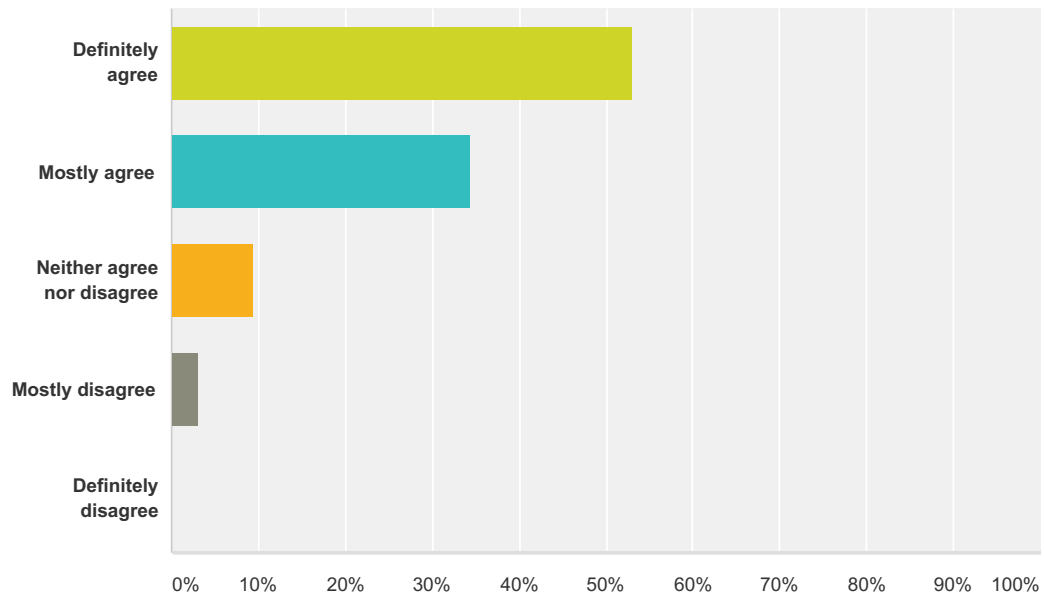

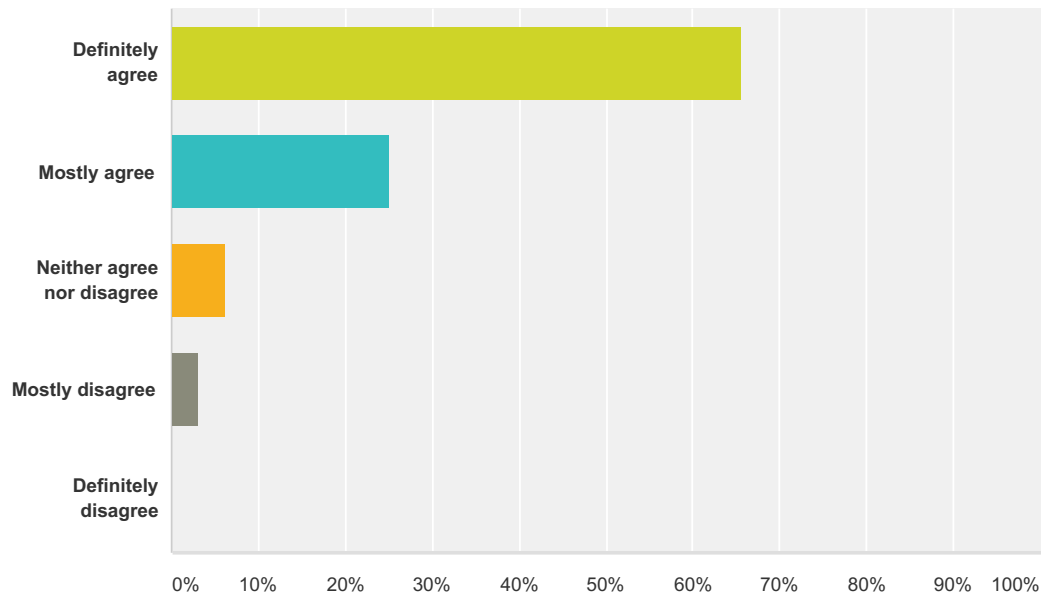

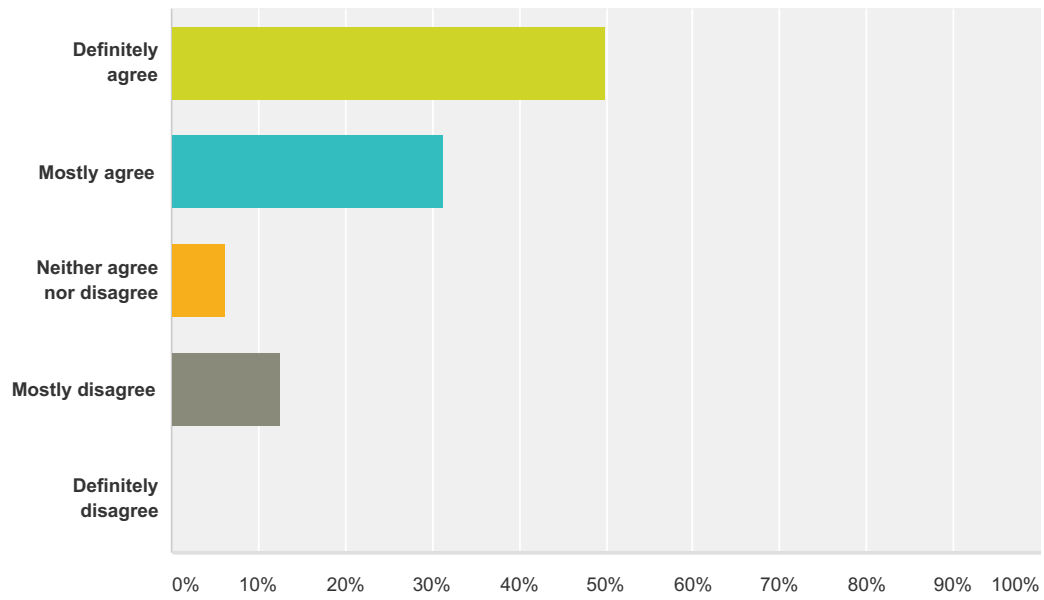

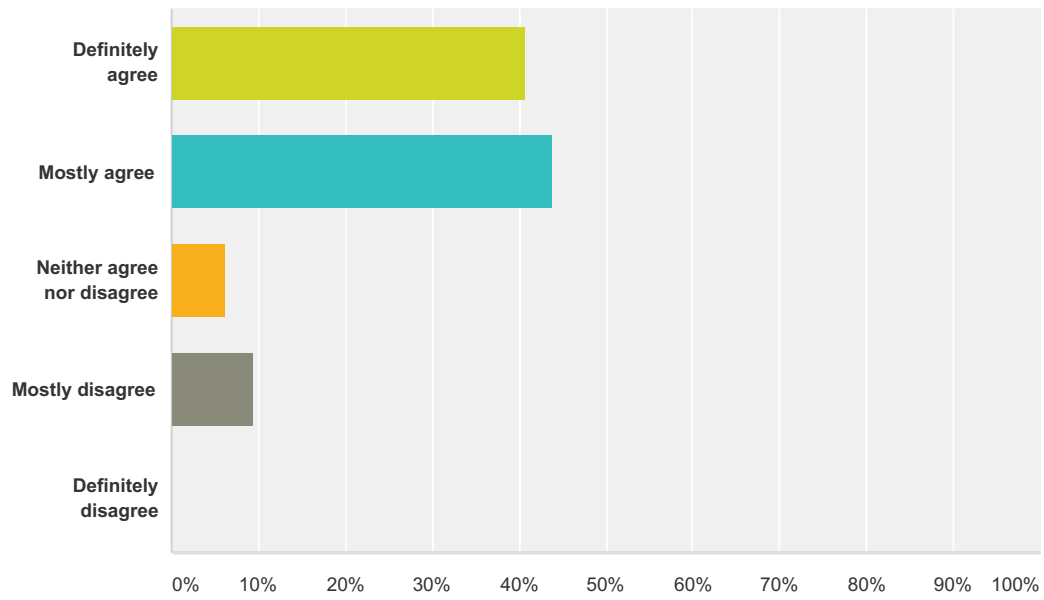

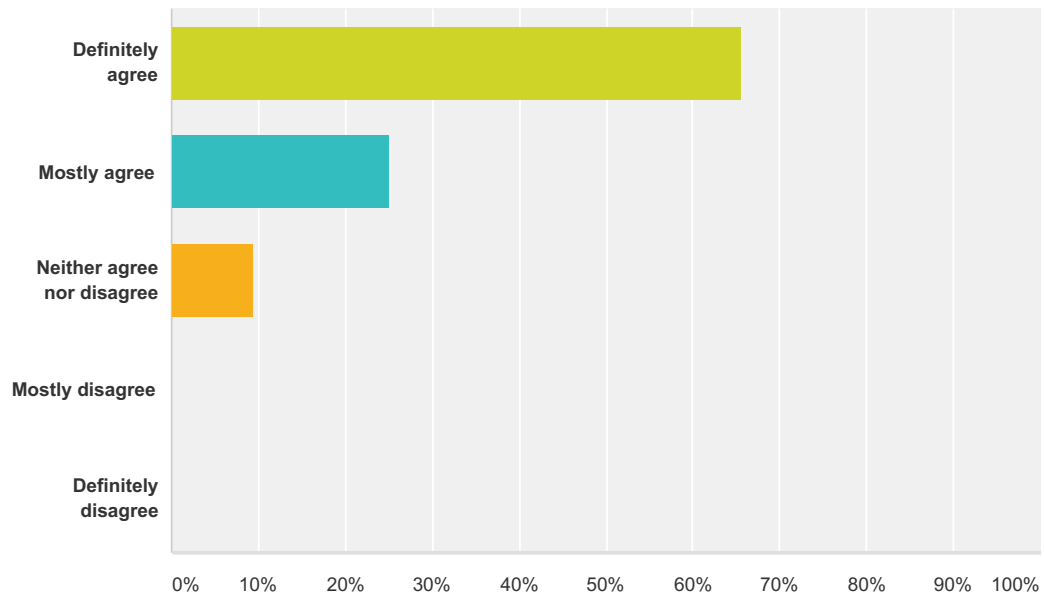

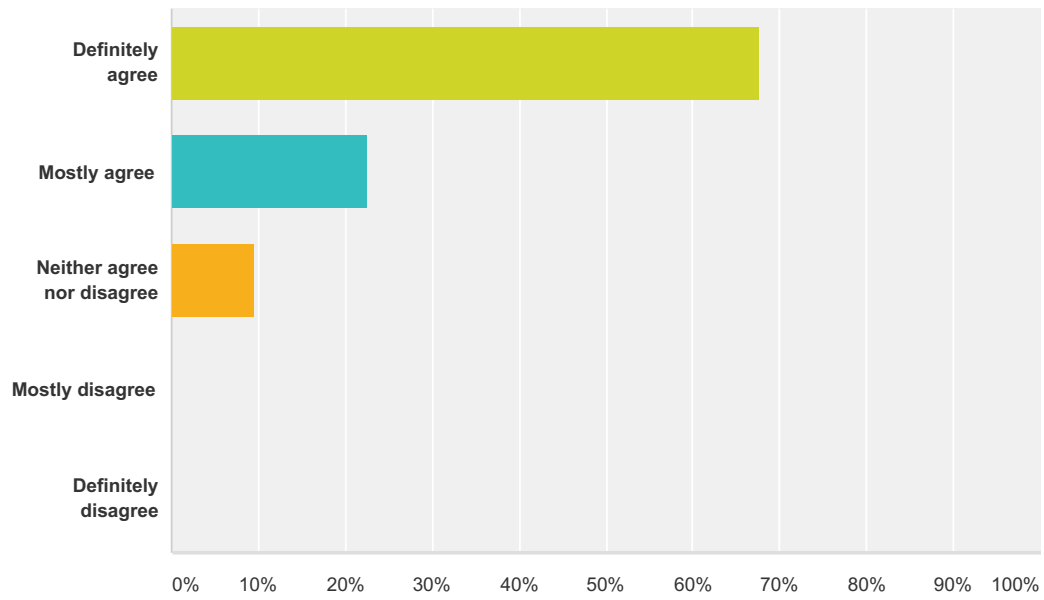

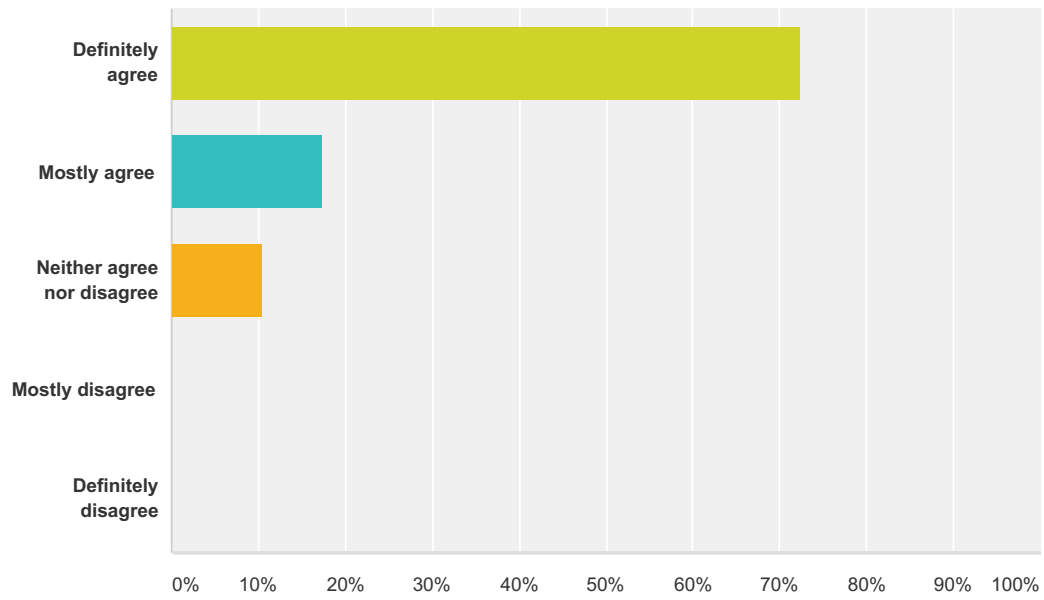

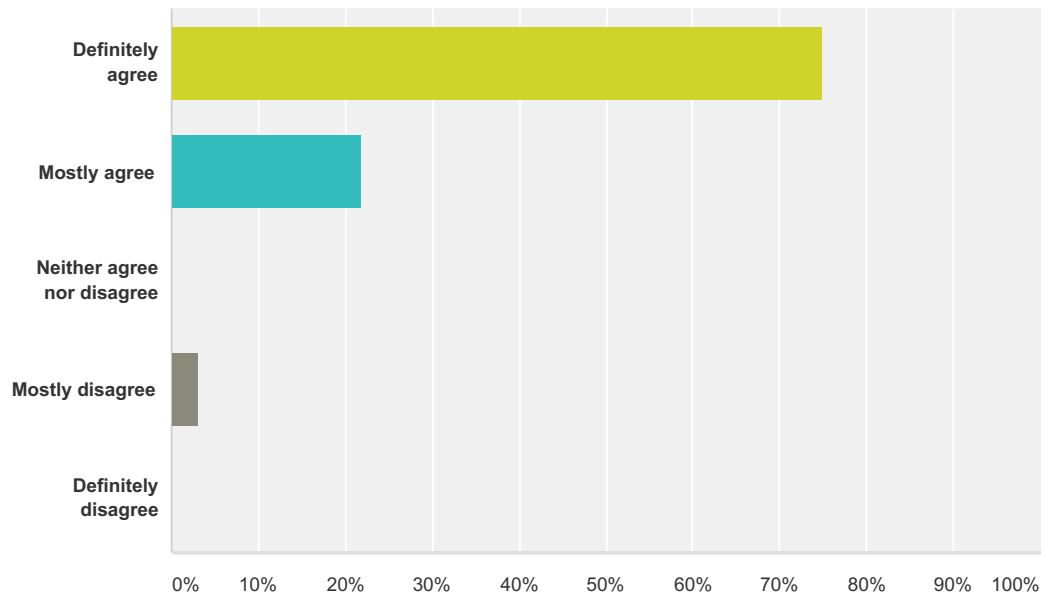

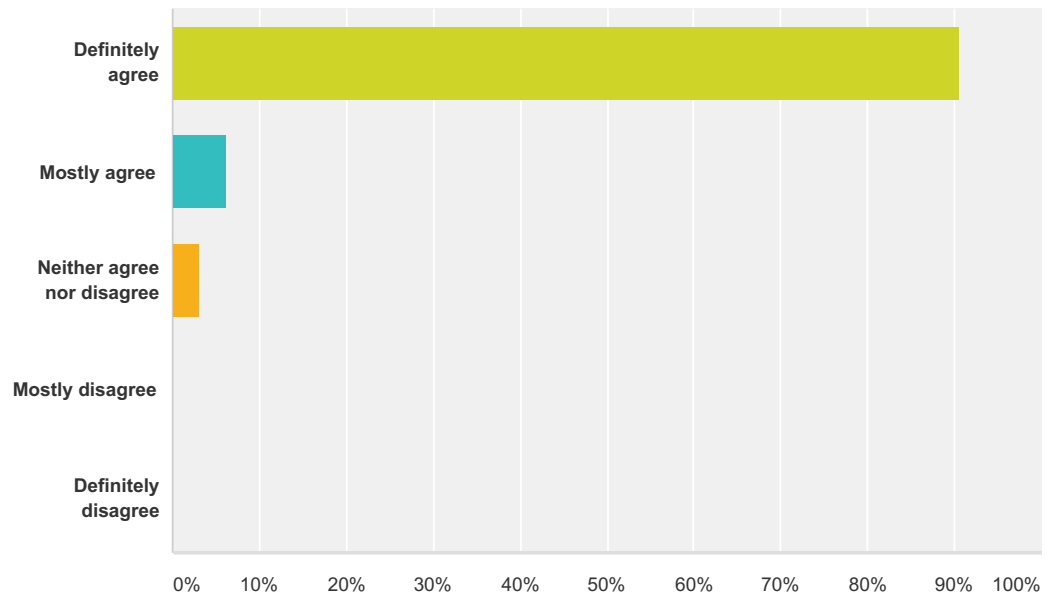

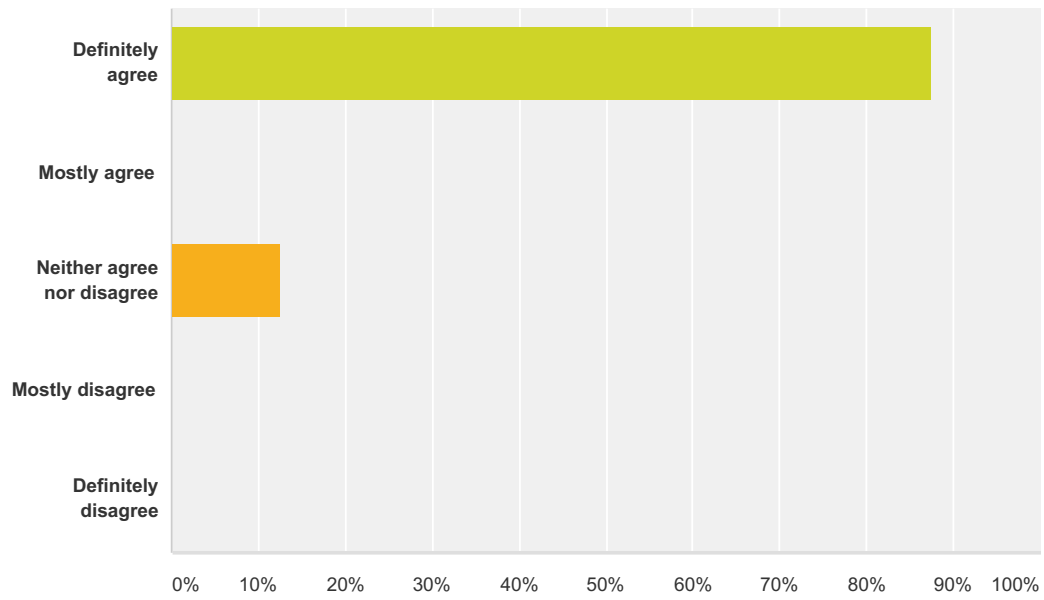
